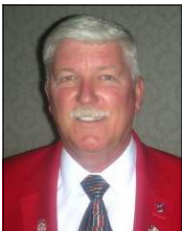

## Courage to Confront Change

Councils should take comfort in the fact some councils have already successfully navigated through the IRS tax law changes. The changes affect all councils, but you can live through it!

Financial Secretaries, who attended the Mid Year Meeting, were briefed on the impact of the changes and steps they needed to take. As a reminder those steps are to first find out what the council or assemblies tax payer identification number (TIN) is. Council may find out that they do not have a TIN, those council must apply for such a number. You may do so from IRS website. Once a TIN is in hand you then may go to the IRS and file the Form 990. Again this may be done from the IRS Website, a very simplified form (electronic postcard) is what councils making less than \$25,000 have to file. Other versions of 990 will apply to those making over \$25,000. Some council who had a TIN may find out their has expired due to inactivity, they must simply reapply for a new TIN. Email me if you need help.

The above was to serve as a reminder to those Financial Secretaries who attend the training at the Mid Year Meeting. I encourage all FS's who did not attend the training session to contact me for the entire information package conveyed at the sessions.

Finally, I have requested that all council forward to me their TIN's, a thanks you goes out to all of you that have already done so, if you have not please do so over the next several weeks.

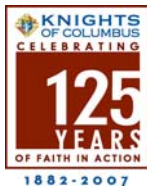
